He is also a type of road manager - drum technicain for the Milkmen for liver performances and rehersals. But recently he has been assaulting the public with recordings of his own (If Someone Says... and Where's JAN GONNA LIVE?). These he credits to the band Earth Shoes for the Needy. In actuality (are you still reading this?) Mr. Earth Shoe plays practically all of the instruments himself, putting down, usually in one take only, one istrumental track over another starting with percussion and ending with vocals.
